The Dutch Short Film Pitch – in collaboration with Screen Talent NL – offers directors based in the Netherlands the chance to present an early-stage film plan or work-in-progress to national and international industry professionals. Participants receive pitch training, present their projects, and build connections that support their films from development to distribution.

During Go Short 2026, 8 films in development and 2 films in production will compete for 4 awards sponsored by Screen Talent NL, CineSud and Qissa.

- 2x €3,000 – a prize for the Best Pitch, sponsored by Screen Talent NL.
- €3,000 – an in-kind award for the Best Film Plan: a spot in the Dutch Film Talents to Cannes CineSud delegation, sponsored by Screen Talent NL in collaboration with CineSud and the Festival de Cannes - Short Film Corner | Rendez-vous Industry.
- €1,000 – a prize for the most innovative film idea, in the form of a development program sponsored by Qissa.

### **Dorien van de Pas (Dial M creative consultancy)**

Dorien van de Pas works as an independent creative consultant in the audiovisual industry and cultural sector under the name Dial M creative consultancy. She works as an advisor for various national and international film- and cultural funds, as a coach/mentor for makers, she is consultant for projects and helps producers to apply at Funds and works as a chair/moderator for selection committees or for a worksession. During her time at the Netherlands Film Fund, she was instrumental in establishing a new department: New Screen NL, which focused on talent development and innovation.



### **Lorenzo Meloni (Venice Film Festival)**

Lorenzo Meloni works as a film critic for numerous Italian publications, including the blog of the Cineteca di Bologna. He is currently conducting a PhD on the theatrical distribution of repertory films. Starting in 2025, he works as a Short Film Advisor for the Venice Film Festival.



### **Wouter Jansen (Square Eyes)**

Wouter Jansen is the founder of the sales company Square Eyes. The company represents bold, author-driven features and shorts, and in close collaboration with the filmmakers it devises bespoke festival distribution and sales strategies. He is an expert for Locarno Open Doors and First Cut Lab, regularly gives lectures at film schools and festivals, engages in selection committees for funding bodies and industry programs.

Blind Spot is an experimental hybrid documentary that centres on Radj, a Surinamese driving instructor in Rotterdam with a passion for filming the sky. As he and his son embark on a magical quest to capture the sun, the film weaves observation, memory, and abstract animation into an intergenerational reflection on migration, labour, and identity, elevating the everyday through imagination.

A young Dutch woman moves to Paris in 1960, where she experiences a traumatic event that she carries with her for the rest of her life. Sixty years later, her daughter travels to Paris to follow in her footsteps. Unraveling her mother's secrets, she sheds light on her own life choices and the reversal of their mother-daughter role. The film poses the personal, universal question: where does my mother end, and where do I begin?

Selling Fantasy is a short documentary set in the raw, cluttered cocoon of a strip club dressing room. Amid perfume, 7-inch Pleasers, and microwave meals, a vital sisterhood unfolds as sexworkers prepare for their shifts. Beyond the glitter, their future is at stake: policy plans threaten to relocate their work to a sterile centre on the outskirts of town, endangering the community and safe space they have.



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

# The Prodigy



Tony is a rebellious skater from rural China, an authoritarian state that wants to reach the world's top ranks in a sport that in the West symbolizes nonconformity and individual freedom.

It is a compelling personal story about the tension between freedom and the pursuit of a golden Olympic medal. The contrast between the fluid style of skate videos—expressing freedom—and the static images of training within four walls, reflecting state control.

Behaviour that deviates from 'the standard' forces someone to stand by their own choices and can bring them closer to themselves. But deviating from societies standard is difficult; it becomes easier by joining a group; thus a new subculture is born.

A filmmaker's attempt to conjure up a disappeared bird - the extinct Paradise Parrot. With the help of a real life parrot 'actor' employed as a voiceover narrator and a small puppet, Sine Loco traces the life of one individual Paradise Parrot from her birthplace in a termite mound in Australia to her death in the Hague Zoo in 1890 and beyond into her afterlife as a skeletal museum specimen.

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Sep Friesema (she/they) is a Dutch multimedia artist, filmmaker, and writer whose practice focuses on creating poetic landscapes through collage and montage, blending digital and analogue culture to discuss themes of ecology, othering, coming-of-age and death. In 2025 she graduated Cum Laude from the AKI ArteEZ.



The Producers Campus is an intensive program for up-and-coming producers focused on furthering them in the next phase of their career. Through workshops, case studies, and peer exchange, participants learn to strategically develop projects and grow an (inter)national network.

From 8-11 April, Go Short is organizing a chock-full three-day program for twelve producers, approximately half of whom are from the Netherlands and half from other countries within geographical Europe. There is room for ten (short) film producers and two producers who specialize in other audiovisual productions, such as film installations, VR or narrative games.

The program consists of a mix of closed and open sessions, to ensure meaningful encounters between the participating producers and other visitors. Throughout the festival week, campus participants take part in various components of the industry program that are focused on knowledge development. Meanwhile, the closed sessions offer space for in-depth exploration, mutual exchange, and a safe environment to discuss individual ideas and challenges.
